I hear a lot about benefits today. If you work for some companies or corporations or the government you can get certain "perks" and benefits. They talk about benefits

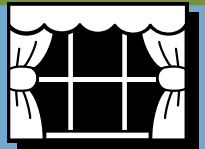

From the Parsonage Window



IT IS WELL WITH MY SOUL — *the rest of the story.*



There are very few of us who don't know this hymn and the story of its genesis. Horatio Spafford wrote the lyrics to, "It Is Well With My Soul," following the loss of all four of his daughters in a tragic accident at sea in 1873. If this was all of the Spafford story and about the Spafford's great faith and acceptance of their loss as God's sovereignty, it would seem enough. The story sends chills down our spines when we hear how his wife telegraphed him, the now famous words, "Saved alone..." He immediately traveled, also by ship, to be with her and was inspired to write the now famous words when his ship passed in the area where the girls died. Philip Bliss then wrote the music, which Ira Sankey published in 1876. What few of us know, though, as famously said, "The rest of the story."

Prior to losing his daughters, his two-year old son had died and the Great Chicago Fire in 1871 nearly ruined him financially. Spafford was a lawyer who had invested heavily in real estate. The economic turndown of 1873 had also seriously impacted the Spaffords. It would seem that this couple could not endure much more. But, following the loss of their daughters, the Spaffords returned to Chicago and had three more children. Then in 1880, another son age four, died of scarlet fever. Sadly, the Presbyterian Church where Horatio was an Elder, saw their tragedies as divine punishment and criticized them severely. When we don't understand what God is doing in our personal lives or the lives of others, we are so quick to judge.

However, in response to this, the Spaffords, in turn, formed their own Messianic sect, dubbed "the Overcomers," by the media of the day. They moved to the Ottoman-Turkish Palestine and settled in Jerusalem forming a commune called the American Colony. In order to work among the people of Jeru-

salem regardless of their religious affiliation, their outreach was philanthropic and not evangelistic. Horatio Spafford believed that theirs was a messianic work, which would hasten the Lord's return. In contrast to the Protestant missionaries in Jerusalem, it is not known that they ever worked for the conversion of those of other faiths.

However, during World War I, the American Colony was a tremendous blessing to thousands with soup kitchens, hospitals, orphanages, and other charitable ventures. Isn't this like so many social organizations today whose vision is to bring about peace with charity.

Although the American Colony ceased to exist as a religious community in the late 1940s, individual members continued to be active in the daily life of Jerusalem. Towards the end of the 1950s, the society's communal residence was converted into the American Colony Hotel, which still exists today. The hotel is an integral part of the Jerusalem landscape where members of all communities in Jerusalem still meet. In 1992, representatives from the Palestine Liberation Organization and Israel met in the hotel where they began talks that led to the historic 1993 Oslo Peace Accord.

Interestingly enough, in researching this story, I discovered three verses which we don't have in our hymnals. It would seem beyond doubt that Mr. Spafford knew the Lord personally. I am quoting a few phrases: "Christ hath regarded my sinless estate and hath shed His own blood for my soul...My sin, not in part but the whole, is nailed to the cross and I bear it no more...For me, be it Christ, be it Christ hence to live."

The rest of the Spafford story about their work was tremendous but it would seem, that based on the word of this hymn, we don't really know the rest of the story. Only in Heaven will we know.

PARBC Spring Conference Guest Speaker

Crescentville Baptist Church Philadelphia, PA



Michael David McCubbins was born into a conservative Jewish family and raised in a conservative Jewish synagogue in Norfolk, Virginia. The synagogue, Congregation Beth El, is the oldest conservative synagogue in the state of Virginia, and all of Pastor McCubbins relatives were members there.

Pastor Michael McCubbins met his wife Elaine while studying at Bob Jones University. They were married in January, 1967. In 1968 Mike took the pastorate of the Baptist Church in Bear Creek, Missouri and later was the assistant pastor of First Baptist Church in Bristol, Pennsylvania. It was at First Baptist Church of Bristol that Mike was ordained and then commissioned as a missionary. The McCubbins family went to Paraguay as missionaries in January 1971.

They first worked in the rural town of Itakyry, with Guarana speaking people. From there they moved to the jungle where their job was to contact a group of nomadic Indians called the Guayaka, or Acha. After the contact, Mike, being a trained linguist, worked on putting the Guayaki language into written form.

After their first furlough, the McCubbins went to Asuncian, the capital of Paraguay, where they were involved in church-planting. Mike started the Maranatha Association of Baptist Churches and served as its president for the first four years. He founded the Maranatha Baptist Bible Institute and Seminary and served as its president for eight years. He also taught classes and wrote the course books for more than half of the subjects.

The McCubbins still have an active part in the ministry in Paraguay. They return almost every year to give Bible conferences and offer counsel and encouragement to the pastors. By 1983 the work was in national hands and the McCubbins began seeking God's direction for their next place of service.

It soon became clear that there was a tremendous need for church planting among the millions of Spanish speaking people who had immigrated to Los Angeles. Confident that this was God's will for them, Mike and Elaine moved to Los Angeles in 1984.

After arrival in Los Angeles, Mike and Elaine planted a bilingual church within the city limits of Los Angeles, and a Spanish-speaking church just outside of L.A. They have planted two churches in Chihuahua, Mexico, and have a branch work in San Juanito, and another in El Ranchito, Mexico.

Mike has written more than one hundred books, mostly on theological studies for the Bible College. Since arriving in Los Angeles they have also started the Bible Baptist College and Seminary and have started branches of the college in more than one hundred and twenty places with over one thousand students. Mike has recorded all the classes on DVDs and presently serves as the president of the Bible College. The college now has graduates in New York City, Puerto Cortes, Honduras, Chontalpa, Mexico, Los Angeles, California, Santa Cruz, Bolivia, Greenville, South Carolina, and several other cities in Mexico. There are several hundred students among the Tzeltal Indians in Chiapas where the classes are translated into Tzeltal. Mike has also recorded classes for the Latin American Video College.
